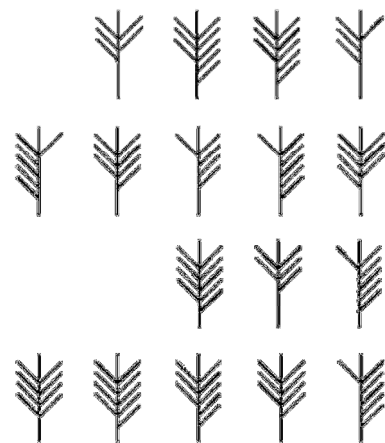

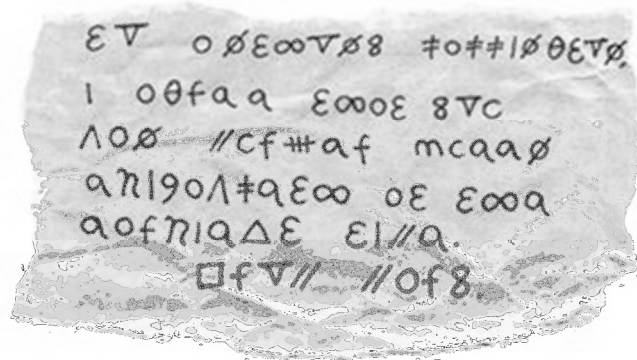

The Zimmerman Telegram (1917 -- WWI)

In 1917 during WWI, German Foreign Secretary Arthur Zimmermann sent an encrypted telegram to the German ambassador Heinrich von Eckardt, who was currently in Mexico.

British cryptographers got hold of the Zimmermann Telegram by eavesdropping on an American cable. Nigel Grey was able to decrypt some of the message in a day and spent the next three weeks with William Montgomery cracking the rest.
